Dear Retirees and Family Members:

On April 30, 2016, West Point will host the Forty-Second Annual Military Retiree Appreciation Day. This day has been set aside to honor Military Retirees and Family members for their selfless service and support to our Nation. I would be honored for you and your Family to spend the day with us.

When entering West Point, vehicles are permitted to enter through any gate, as long as all occupants over the age of 17 have a military ID. If anyone in your party does not have a military ID you must report to the Visitor's Center to obtain a pass with a valid state or federal valid ID. To expedite the process complete the form on page 16 (on the back of the pamphlet) and mail it to the address on the form. If unable to mail the form, go to the Visitor's Center early on April 30th to obtain a pass. Designated parking is available in the vicinity of Eisenhower Hall, North Dock, and west of Gillis Field House. Shuttle buses will be available from 0715-0930 to transport you to Eisenhower Hall. Limited handicapped parking will be available in the Eisenhower Hall Tunnel Area.

The West Point Chapter of the Association of the U. S. Army is sponsoring a Buffet Breakfast in Ike's Café starting at 0700. The cost per person will be \$13.00. If you would like to attend, please complete the reservation form on page 13 and mail it to the address on the reservation form.

Upon arriving at Eisenhower Hall, please proceed to the Ballroom Level (4) to register at the Reception Desks. There will be two separate registration areas, one for those with luncheon reservations, and one for those without. All participants must wear name tags during movement in the Cadet area. Take advantage of the "county fair" in the Eisenhower Hall Mezzanine area to visit with participating service agencies from 0730-1100. At 0830, the Superintendent, LTG Robert L. Caslen Jr., will welcome all Retirees and guests in the Theater. Following the guest speakers and the formal portion of the program, between 1040 and 1120 you will proceed to The Plain.

At 1120, ten minutes prior to the Review, the Cadet Drill Team will perform on The Plain. The Review will begin at 1130 and the luncheon in the USMA Cadet Mess will start promptly at 1230. The luncheon is open to all participants, however, reservations are required. Complete the reservation form on page 2 and mail it to the address indicated with your check or money order. Reservations must be received by April 20, 2016. Buses will be available at the conclusion of the program to return those not attending the luncheon to the designated parking areas. Pickup will be on Thayer Road Extension, directly behind the bleachers. Buses will also be available in the same location to take those unable to make the walk to the USMA Cadet Mess for the luncheon. Immediately following the meal, shuttle buses will again be available from the Mess Hall to the designated parking areas.

Two valid forms of identification are required for issuance of any and all military ID cards to personnel 21 years of age and older. One must be an unexpired photo ID issued by state or federal government. Other documentation may be necessary if your military ID card has expired i.e. birth certificate and social security card. All lost ID cards must be reported to the nearest local police station or at the West Point Military Police Station. A copy of the report is required to issue a new ID card. Must bring: Military ID, Vehicle Registration, Insurance Card and Driver's License.
All customers registering vehicles must provide the documents listed above. Customers will only be issued the DoD Registered Vehicle Decal (DD Form 2220) and the Installation decal corresponding with the customer's affiliation (Retired, NCO, Officer, Civilian). The West Point Casualty Operations Office provides Casualty Assistance for families of Army retirees who reside in the New York counties of Orange, Rockland, Sullivan, Dutchess, Columbia, Ulster, Greene, Delaware, Putnam and northern Westchester. The Fort Drum Casualty Assistance Center supports residents of the other New York counties and the states of Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire. Immediate notification of a retiree death will enable the Casualty Operations Office to notify the Defense Finance and Accounting Service in a timely manner to stop the retired pay. The sooner this is done the sooner benefits can be received by the surviving spouse. ***Checklists are published periodically in the Army Echoes.*** Be sure to update your checklist and let your family know where it is located. Also, be sure your family knows where your DD 214 is located. It is ***required*** to receive Military Funeral Honors.

They represent CARC in council meetings of the New England Army Retiree Council (NEARC), held in Shirley, MA. During this past year SGM (Ret) Zimmerman was elected to a similar position with NEARC.

Our membership is composed of officers and non-commissioned officers from throughout Connecticut who participate in quarterly meetings held at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Newington, CT. The majority of our members are affiliated with veteran organizations, providing us with diversity that results in the sharing and dissemination of data relevant and informative to retirees. The format for our meetings usually involves a guest speaker, reports from the West Point Retiree Council, and NEARC; and an open forum that allows our members to share information or raise issues for discussion.

During the past four meetings issues discussed included, a presentation by the Small Business Administration and how they assist the veteran, a review of bills promulgated by the CT Legislature that have an impact on veterans/retirees, an expansion of the State's military cemetery in Middletown, the RAD at the New London Submarine Base and West Point, a new VFW Chapter Post in New Haven, the CT Coalition to End Homelessness and scams directed at veterans.

WHO IS YOUR DESIGNATED BENEFICIARY FOR YOUR UNPAID RETIRED PAY ??

Your Retiree Account Statement lists the person or persons you designated to receive your prorated final pay known as Arrears of Pay (AOP). Entitlement to retired pay stops on the date of a retiree’s death, leaving unpaid pay depending on the date of death, for example, if a retiree dies on the 7th of the month, 7 days worth of unpaid pay would be payable to your beneficiary. The AOP may include overpaid SBP premiums and returned allotment payments for the final month. Be sure your information is current! The Beneficiary Designation Form (DD Form 2894) allows you to elect one or more beneficiaries, assigning a percentage of the total to each. You can designate anyone to be your beneficiary. You will need to provide the name, address, social security number and relationship of each beneficiary. The form is available online at: www.dfas.mil under Retired Pay or ask your RSO at (845) 938-4217/2355.

TRICARE RETIREE DENTAL PROGRAM

Save your smile, your health and your money

Do you see your dentist at least twice a year for regular checkups? If so, you have an excellent chance of keeping your teeth and gums healthy for a very long time. Because your mouth is the gateway to the rest of your body, maintaining good oral health is important—but even routine dental care can be costly, sometimes averaging several hundred dollars each year. Fortunately, the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) can keep you smiling *and* help you maintain your overall health, all at an affordable cost. Here are just some of the many reasons why more than 1.5 million current enrollees find the TRDP to be such a good value:

- You get your routine annual services—two cleanings (or *three* with diagnosed Type 1/ Type 2 diabetes), two exams and an x-ray—with no cost share when you see a TRDP network dentist. And, these services don't count towards your annual maximum or deductible!
- Seeing a network dentist helps you save an average of 22% on your covered dental care. With the TRDP, there is a large nationwide network of dentists from which to choose. To find a network dentist near you, use the “Find a Dentist” link at trdp.org.
- Network dentists accept the TRDP allowed fee for covered services, so there are no surprise costs beyond your expected cost share and deductible, where applicable.
- Each enrollee gets a generous \$1,300 annual maximum, a \$1,200 annual dental accident maximum and a \$1,750 lifetime orthodontic maximum.
- The TRDP coordinates benefits with other dental plans, allowing you to maximize your coverage under both plans.

To enroll in the TRDP, visit trdp.org and choose the method that works best for you. Enrolling online using the Quick Link to the Beneficiary Web Enrollment (BWE) site is quickest, or you can print an application from the TRDP website and mail it to Delta Dental along with your prepayment amount.

After enrolling, you're encouraged to register for the online Consumer Toolkit[®], where you can verify your program eligibility; review your benefits coverage levels and remaining maximums and deductibles; check on the status of your processed claims and claim payments; and sign up for paperless (electronic) Explanation of Benefits statements. Don't wait to improve your oral health and your quality of life. Enroll in the TRDP today! And, while you're at this year's Retiree Appreciation Day, make sure to stop by the TRDP table with any questions you might have.

Keller Army Community Hospital provides high-quality, patient-centered care, with a focus on health and wellness, to improve readiness of the military force and enhance the lives of all our beneficiaries: Active Duty, Guard and Reserve military members, Cadets, Retirees, and Family Members of all age groups.

The Brian D. Allgood Ambulatory Clinic addition opened in October 2015. This state-of-the-art facility provides an anchor for all primary care and most of the specialty care available at West Point.

If your drive-time to West Point is less than one hour, you may choose to receive guaranteed access to primary care at Keller. Call the Health Benefits Advisors at the number listed to find out how to enroll in TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Plus at Keller or to determine the best TRICARE options for you and your family members.

Pathology, radiology and pharmacy services are available to Retired Service Members and their Family Members with an order or prescription from a civilian provider; however, call to be sure we can provide what you need. You can also access Keller's specialty care on a space-available basis by calling the Appointment Center at the number listed in the previous page.

TRICARE SERVICE



Beneficiaries in the TRICARE North Region can connect to Health Net's mobile site at www.hbfs.com/go/mobile. This streamlined version of www.hnfs.com can be accessed on smart phones and tablets with no download required. You can locate TRICARE-authorized providers, Health Net contact information, mental health resources and answers to frequently asked TRICARE questions. Health Net also offers an app for your smart phone called "Health Net Mobile," which enables you to view details about your TRICARE benefits and to find a provider.

TRICARE AND THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT (ACA)

Beneficiaries who receive TRICARE benefits at no cost, by paying an enrollment fee or by paying monthly premiums have minimum essential coverage under the ACA. Benefit options include: TRICARE Standard, Prime and Prime Remote; TRICARE Reserve Select (TRS); TRICARE Young Adult (TYA); TRICARE Retired Reserve (TRR); and the Continued Health Care Benefit Program (CHCBP). Beneficiaries eligible for TRS, TYA, TRR and CHCBP must be current with their premiums in order to maintain coverage and for these TRICARE programs to qualify as minimum essential coverage. Visit www.tricare.mil for further information and to request email alerts about these TRICARE programs and other TRICARE issues. TRICARE beneficiaries are required to declare other health insurance (OHI) to ensure coordination of benefits. If OHI is no longer available, the coverage termination date must be provided to TRICARE by calling Health Net Federal Services at (877) 874-2273. In most cases, TRICARE will become the primary payer and understanding the benefit will become vital. Become more informed by visiting www.tricare.mil or www.hnfs.com or by calling Health Net at (877) 874-2273. Our Health Benefits Advisors can also explain the various options such as enrolling in TRICARE Prime at Keller or with a civilian network provider or perhaps enrolling in TRICARE Plus to receive guaranteed access to primary care at Keller. Call (845) 938-4838 to get answers to your questions and to find the TRICARE options best suited to you and your Family members.

ELECTRONIC PRESCRIPTION PROGRAM

Civilian medical providers can send electronic prescriptions to the pharmacy at Keller Army Community Hospital and most electronic prescriptions are ready for you when you arrive. Some medications, for example controlled substances, will continue to require a paper prescription.


