Dear Retirees and Family Members:

On April 29, 2017, West Point will host the Forty-Third Annual Military Retiree Appreciation Day. This day has been set aside to honor Military Retirees and Family members for their selfless-service and support to our Nation. I would be honored for you and your Family to spend the day with us.

When entering West Point, vehicles are permitted to enter through Thayer or Stony Lonesome gate. Designated parking is available in the vicinity of Eisenhower Hall, North Dock and west of Gillis Field House. Shuttle buses will be available from 7:15 – 9:30 a.m. to transport you to Eisenhower Hall. Limited handicapped parking will be available in the Eisenhower Hall Tunnel Area.

The West Point Chapter of the Association of the U.S. Army is sponsoring a Buffet Breakfast in Ike's Café starting at 7 a.m. The cost per person will be \$13.00. If you would like to attend, please complete the reservation form on page 13 and mail it to the address on the reservation form.

Upon arriving at Eisenhower Hall, please proceed to the Ballroom, Level 4, to register at the reception desks. There will be two separate registration areas, one for those with luncheon reservations and one for those without. All participants must wear name tags in the Cadet area. Please take advantage of our "county fair" in the Eisenhower Hall Ballroom and visit with participating service agencies from 7 – 11:30 a.m. At 8:25 a.m. we will have a general briefing in the theater at Eisenhower hall and the 59th Superintendent of the U.S. Military Academy, Lieutenant General Robert L. Caslen Jr., will welcome all Retirees and guests. Following the briefing we ask that between 10:40 - 11:20 a.m. you please proceed to The Plain for the Cadet Review.

The review will begin at 11:30 a.m. Ten minutes prior to the review, the Cadet Drill Team will perform on The Plain. After the review the luncheon in the U.S. Military Academy at West Point Cadet Mess will start promptly at 12:30 p.m. The luncheon is open to all participants, however, reservations are required. Complete the reservation form on page 2 and mail it to the address indicated with your check or money order. Reservations must be received by April 21, 2017. Buses will be available at the conclusion of the program to return those not attending the luncheon to the designated parking areas. The pickup area for the bus will be directly behind the bleachers on The Plain. Buses will also be available in the same location to take those unable to make the walk to the Cadet Mess for the luncheon. Immediately following the meal, shuttle buses will again be available from the Mess Hall to the designated parking areas.

Two valid forms of identification are required for issuance of any and all military ID cards to personnel 21 years of age and older. One must be an unexpired photo ID issued by state or federal government. Other documentation may be necessary if your military ID card has expired i.e. birth certificate and social security card. All lost ID cards must be reported to the nearest local police station or at the West Point Military Police desk. A copy of the report is required to issue a new ID card. Vehicle Registration for Department of Defense Decals, Building 616

Must bring: Military ID, Vehicle Registration, Insurance Card and Driver's License.

All customers registering vehicles must provide the documents listed above. Customers will only be issued the DoD Registered Vehicle Decal (DD Form 2220) and the Installation decal corresponding with the customer's affiliation (Retired, NCO, Officer, Civilian).

Casualty Assistance for Family Members, Building 622

The West Point Casualty Operations Office provides Casualty Assistance for families of Army retirees who reside in the New York counties of Orange, Rockland, Sullivan, Dutchess, Columbia, Ulster, Greene, Delaware, Putnam and northern Westchester. The phone number is (845) 938-4217. The Fort Drum Casualty Assistance Center supports residents of the other northern New York counties and the states of Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire. The phone number is (888) 325-1601 or (315) 772-6465. Immediate notification of a retiree death will enable the Casualty Operations Office to notify the Defense Finance and Accounting Service in a timely manner to stop the retired pay. The sooner this is done the sooner benefits can be received by the surviving spouse. **Checklists are published periodically in the Army Echoes.** Be sure to update your checklist and let your family know where it is located. Also, be sure your family knows where your DD 214 is located. It is **required** to receive Military Funeral Honors.

National Cemetery Burial Benefits

Burial benefits available include a gravesite in any of the 135 national cemeteries with available space, opening and closing of the grave, perpetual care, a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag and a Presidential Memorial Certificate, at no cost to the family. Some Veterans may also be eligible for Burial Allowances. Cremated remains are buried or inurned in national cemeteries in the same manner and with the same honors as casketed remains. Burial benefits available for spouses and dependents buried in a national cemetery include burial with the Veteran, perpetual care, and the spouse or dependents name and date of birth and death will be inscribed on the Veteran's headstone, at no cost to the family. Eligible spouses and dependents may be buried, even if they predecease the veteran. The Veteran's family should make funeral or cremation arrangements with a funeral provider. Any item or service obtained from a funeral director or cremation office will be at the family's expense.

Burial Flags

A United States flag is provided at no cost to drape the casket or accompany the urn of a deceased Veteran who served honorably in the U.S. Armed Forces. It is furnished to honor the memory of the Veteran's military service to his or her country. You should advise you family of your wishes and be sure they have your DD 214 (Statement of Discharge). It is **required** to establish eligibility for all VA benefits.

Who is Your Designated Beneficiary for your Unpaid Retired Pay??

Your Retiree Account Statement lists the person or persons you designated to receive your prorated final pay known as Arrears of Pay (AOP). Entitlement to retired pay stops on the date of a retiree's death, leaving unpaid pay depending on the date of death, for example, if a retiree dies on the 18th of the month, 18 days worth of unpaid pay would be payable to your beneficiary. The AOP may include overpaid SBP premiums and returned allotment payments for the final month. Be sure your information is current! The Beneficiary Designation Form (DD Form 2894) allows you to elect one or more beneficiaries, assigning a percentage of the total to each. You can designate anyone to be your beneficiary. You will need to provide the name, address, social security number and relationship of each beneficiary. The form is available online at: www.dfas.mil under Retired Pay or ask your RSO at (845) 938-4217.

Stewart Air National Guard Base, Space "A" Travel Information

The Retired Activities Office (RAO) at Stewart Air National Guard Base (ANGB), 1 Maguire Way, Newburgh, NY 12550, operates a Space Availability (Space A) Office. The office is manned Mon-Fri, 0900-1200 except holidays. Volunteer Passenger Agents from all Service Branches can explain the requirements of the Space A Program as well as identify scheduled Space A flights from Stewart ANGB. The **contact number is (845) 563-2369**. Travelers can sign up for Space A flights from Stewart ANGB by sending an email to takeahop.com or usaf.ny.105-space-a@mail.mil or by **faxing AMC Form 140 (Request to Travel) to (845) 563-2398** or **sign up in person at the Space A Office**. The 105th Airlift Wing at Stewart ANGB flies the C-17 Globemaster III aircraft. Space A flights are now scheduled from Stewart ANGB to Europe every month. Passenger Agents can tell you about the Guard Lifts that go elsewhere and provide information about Space A travel and Temporary Military Lodging. Physical Therapy Holds “Sick Call” at Keller Army Community Hospital

The physical therapy clinic at Keller Army Community Hospital continues to see patients on a walk-in basis (no referral needed) who sustain new injuries. The intent of this program is for members of the West Point community to quickly receive an evaluation, diagnosis, and plan of care as soon as possible. This service is available promptly at 0730 on most weekdays.

This time is not intended for chronic conditions that have been ongoing for weeks or months. For these more chronic conditions, routine appointments can be made (with or without referral) by calling (845) 938-3324. Physical Therapy sick call will generally be closed whenever the PT clinic is closed, such as federal holidays, weekends, hospital training days, and others as announced .

Before driving to West Point before and after Federal Holidays, call our information line or check the Keller Army Community Hospital website and/or Facebook page for hospital hours and closings. Call (845) 938-7000 to check local road conditions to ensure the post is open during inclement weather.

Keller Army Community Hospital has installed two, secure, MedSafe Medication Disposal Bins in an effort to establish a procedure for the handling and disposal of expired, unwanted, unused prescriptions drugs and Over-The-Counter (OTC) medications. The medical disposal bins are for unused medications, including legally held controlled substances. This includes narcotics (Schedules II-V). No illegal drugs (Schedule I) are allowed. One bin is located on the first floor lobby as you enter Keller's main building, and the second bin is located on the first floor of the Brian D. Allgood Clinic near Primary Care.

Medication should be left in its original packaging/containers. NO liquid containers – more than 4 ounces – will be accepted, and ALL liquids should be placed in a sealed plastic baggy before depositing. NO sharp containers, needles, syringes, batteries, aerosol spray cans, trash, medical devices, chemicals, or other hazardous material should be placed in the bins. If you need to dispose of 'epi pens,' you can drop them off at the Keller Pharmacy. The bin is available during the Hospital's operating hours. If the bins are locked, please return during the operating hours. DO NOT leave medication outside of the bins.

TriCare Service



Beneficiaries in the TRICARE North Region can connect to Health Net's mobile site at <https://hnfs.com/>. This streamlined version of be accessed on smart phones and tablets with no download required. You can locate TRI-CARE-authorized providers, Health Net contact information, mental health resources and answers to frequently asked TRICARE questions. Health Net also offers an app for your smart phone called "Health Net Mobile," which enables you to view details about your TRICARE benefits and to find a provider.

TriCare and the Affordable Care Act (ACA)

Beneficiaries who receive TRICARE benefits at no cost, by paying an enrollment fee or by paying monthly premiums have minimum essential coverage under the ACA. Benefit options include: TRICARE Standard, Prime and Prime Remote; TRICARE Reserve Select (TRS); TRICARE Young Adult (TYA); TRICARE Retired Reserve (TRR); and the Continued Health Care Benefit Program (CHCBP). Beneficiaries eligible for TRS, TYA, TRR and CHCBP must be current with their premiums in order to maintain coverage and for these TRICARE programs to qualify as minimum essential coverage. Visit www.tricare.mil for further information and to request email alerts about these TRICARE programs and other TRICARE issues.

TRICARE beneficiaries are required to declare other health insurance (OHI) to ensure coordination of benefits. If OHI is no longer available, the coverage termination date must be provided to TRICARE by calling Health Net Federal Services at (877) 874-2273. In most cases, TRICARE will become the primary payer and understanding the benefit will become vital. Become more informed by visiting www.tricare.mil or www.hnfs.com or by calling Health Net at (877) 874-2273. Our Health Benefits Advisors can also explain the various options such as enrolling in TRICARE Prime at Keller or with a civilian network provider or perhaps enrolling in TRICARE Plus to receive guaranteed access to primary care at Keller. Call (845) 938-4838 to get answers to your questions and to find the TRICARE options best suited to you and your Family members.

Electronic Prescription Program

Civilian medical providers can send electronic prescriptions to the pharmacy at Keller Army Community Hospital and most electronic prescriptions are ready for you when you arrive. Some medications, for example controlled substances, will continue to require a paper prescription.

TRICARE Retiree Dental Program: Good Dental Health Is Vital To Good Overall Health

To enroll in the TRDP, visit trdp.org and choose the method that works best for you. Enrolling online using the Quick Link to the Beneficiary Web Enrollment (BWE) site is quickest, or you can print an application from the TRDP website and mail it to Delta Dental along with your prepayment amount.

After enrolling, you’re encouraged to register for the online Consumer Toolkit[®], where you can verify your program eligibility; review your benefits, coverage levels and remaining maximums and deductibles; check on the status of your processed claims and claim payments; and sign up for paperless (electronic) Explanation of Benefits statements.

Your oral health plays a big role in your overall well-being and quality of life. Enroll in the TRDP today—and enjoy regular, affordable dental care that’s essential for your lifelong health and peace of mind. 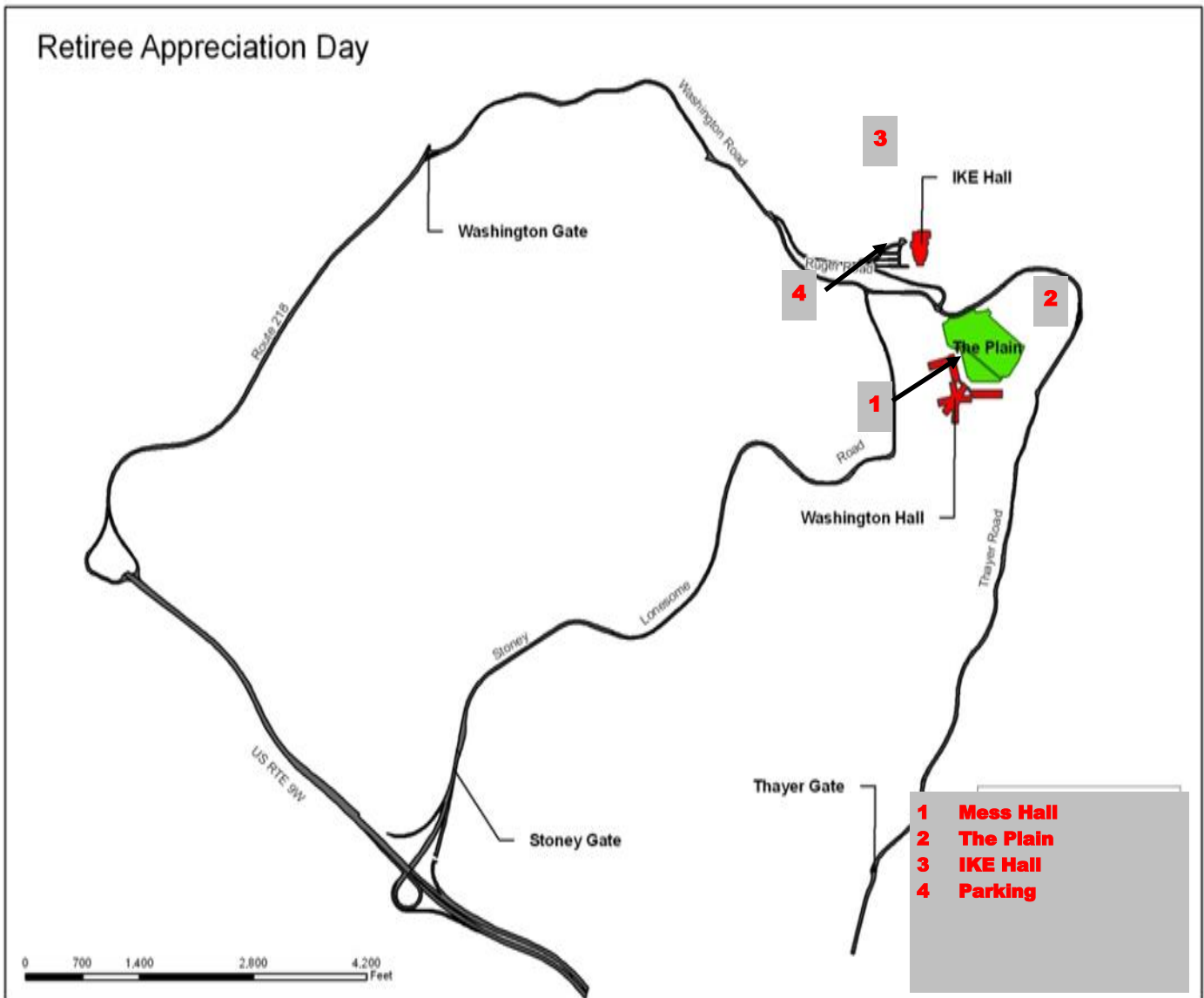
